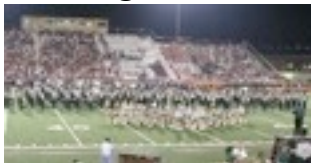

And we continue to provide a variety of areas where students can study, complete assignments, browse books, and access our many print and digital resources.

Speaking of resources, there have been some changes and additions to the resources available to our school community. Visit www.neisd.net/reagan and click on Library to access:

- eBooks to read in your internet browser window – in eLibrary, change the campus from "Reagan High School" to "Electronic Books at NEISD" and search your topic

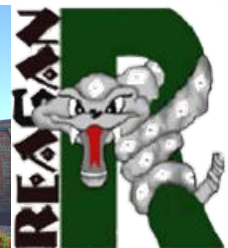

Reagan Theatre's *Much Ado About Nothing* Brought Much Merriment to Stage

Audiences glimpsed the lighter side of Shakespeare in October with the Reagan Theatre's production of *Much Ado About Nothing*. Yet for all its fun and frivolity, the comedy offered serious moments, and challenged two leading actors to portray characters who convinced audiences of the true feelings they had hidden even from themselves.

The play, directed by the Reagan Theatre Department's Mrs. Gloria Robinson, told the story of Benedick and Beatrice, a pair who engage in verbal sparring and insults while denying their secret attraction.

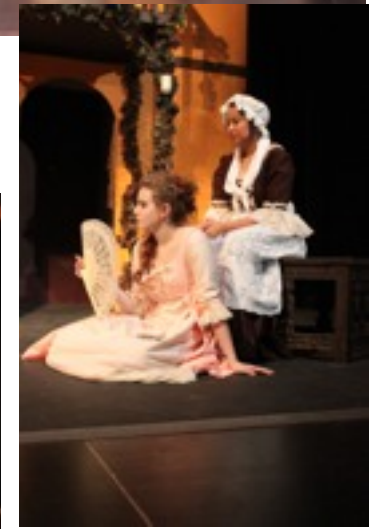
Senior Preston Richard, who played Benedick, noted that the quick transformation of his character from scorning to adoring Beatrice was not so surprising. "He gives a whole monologue explaining how he will never love a woman, followed by another proclaiming his love for Beatrice, all in the same scene," said Preston. "The truth is, he always loved her, he was just too prideful to admit it. The real challenge was trying to show the audience he loved her without looking like he loved her."

For Junior Olivia Abiassi, cast as Beatrice, it was the comedic moments, such as the scene where she is led to eavesdrop by her scheming cousin Hero, that became a favorite. "It was fun because I could immediately respond to the audience and really amp it up and play with it!" she said.

A second love story, that of Hero, played by Junior Jenny Robbins and Claudio, portrayed by Senior Mason Hensley, offered tense moments as Claudio accused Hero at their wedding of being untrue. Senior Mo Ortiz, in a hilarious role as Dogberry, led a comic team of watchmen who ultimately exposed the evil schemes of Don John, played by Senior Nick Chaves.

About 70 students from the Technical Theatre Classes of Technical Director Mr. James Kaiser comprised the crew that worked on lights, sound and built the elaborate set, complete with a balcony and a splashing fountain. In addition, Mrs. Sarah Pagona's Art class students lent their talents painting touches of texture.

Next up, the Reagan Theatre Department will take on a very different theatrical genre as they present the Greek tragedy *Medea*, November 16-19.





Reagan Choir News

The Reagan High School Choral program under the direction of Mary Cowart and her assistant, Christian De la Cruz, has been running on all cylinders these past three months. With the amazing support of the Reagan Choir Booster Club, 220 choir students performed stunningly at their annual Fall Concert in front of a packed auditorium after a very successful Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser and Silent Auction.

On top of learning the music for the Fall Concert during their choir classes, students also packed the choir room before and after school to prepare for the three All-Region competitions late September and October. Of the 31 participating High School choir programs ranging from Seguin, Canyon, New Braunfels, Judson, East Central, and San Antonio ISDs, the Reagan Choir Program came out on top with 71 students in the All-Region choirs.



The next closest school has 36 students in the choirs. Reagan makes up 27% of the entire region choir, with the other 30 schools filling the other spots. Ms. Cowart and Mr. De la Cruz want to express how proud they are of the tremendous amount of work their students put in to these competitions. It reaffirms their core belief that a strong work ethic is the key to success.

Reagan Theatre's Tragic *Medea* Weaves a Classic and Chilling Tale

Medea, a dark tale of betrayal and revenge, has thrilled theatre-goers dating back to the times B.C. This month, a contemporary audience is invited to experience Reagan High School Theatre's version of this classic Greek tragedy, with performances November 16 - 19.

The play recounts the story of rumored sorceress Medea, played by Senior Brogan Lozano, and Jason, portrayed by Senior Mason Hensley. After Medea helps Jason obtain the Golden Fleece, the two marry but deadly events follow their union and exile.

"Several faculty members asked that we do a Greek classic," said Reagan Theatre Director Mrs. Gloria Robinson about this year's selection. "Also, we teach *Medea* in Theatre I and the students are enthralled with deep, dark tragedy. They think this sort of thing could never happen and then we refer to current news about the same subject."

The Reagan Theatre department presents to the community exciting productions in a variety of genres. Reagan Theatre's dedicated students develop skills and broaden their artistic range as they perform comedies, tragedies, musical theatre and contemporary theatre, in works from playwrights from across the centuries.

Transitioning from their season's opener, the Shakespeare comedy *Much Ado About Nothing*, to the tragic themes of *Medea* offered the young actors the opportunity to hone different aspects of their talents.

The change in genre also meant a shift for the student technical crew. While the stage for the Shakespeare comedy sported warm colors, flowers and a fountain, the latest production required a set far more abstract, dark and foreboding. "*Medea* will be in dark reds and metallic colors with hard edges to make it look cold and mean," said Technical Director Mr. James Kaiser. Sound, lighting effects, and smoke-breathing snakes will contribute to the chilling atmosphere.

Current 9th graders will be the first class to take the STAAR/EOC exams. There will be an informational meeting in the Reagan auditorium at 6:30 PM on November 9, 2011. The PSAT was administered to 10th and 11th grade students on October 12. Results should be back late December, and distributed at the Parent Night scheduled for January 5, 2012, in the Reagan auditorium at 6:00 PM.

November 9 is Course Fair at Reagan High School for the 2012-2013 school year.

Information about Pre-AP and AP course sequences will be available in the Fine Arts building from 5:30 - 6:30 PM. The Elective Fair will be held in the cafeteria from 6:00 - 8:30 PM. Students will register online through the North East ISD website with a connection through the Reagan website in November.

Parents and students who attended the Senior Parent Night on September 19 received valuable information about applying to college and financing higher education. Two PowerPoint presentations from that meeting can be accessed through the Reagan website.

Counselors continue senior visits with the expectation that all seniors will have a conference by the end of November. We will continue to complete senior applications and recommendation letters through the spring semester.

Parents of seniors should be aware of the deadlines for early admission to college. Many of those deadlines are in early November or December. The University of Texas has the earliest deadline for regular admission, December 1, but many other universities follow in early to mid-January. Transcripts must be requested five (5) days prior to mailing, and counselor and teacher recommendation letters 10 days prior to mailing. Students should see Mrs. Miller at the transcript desk in the counseling office to order transcripts and turn in their requests for recommendations. It is the student's responsibility to request from College Board or ACT that their score reports be sent to the university or scholarship program.

Several websites are helpful in the college testing and application process. To apply to any and all public Texas colleges, use www.applytexas.org. To register for the SAT or ACT, use www.collegeboard.com and www.act.org. Student athletes can contact the NCAA at www.ncaa.org. The senior newsletter is updated on the Reagan website on a regular basis. Students and parents can go there for information on applications and on scholarships.

College representatives are visiting with students several times each week. A list of college and university visits for the current month is posted outside the counseling office. Underclassmen as well as seniors can take advantage of one-on-one time with these representatives.
